"Permission to Forget" is a \$100 billion problem. The current cost of America's public schools is approximately \$2 billion per day. On the average, teachers spend 50 to 60 days a year reviewing prior year's content for a cost of \$100 billion a year.

Current educators did not invent the cram, get a grade, forget cycle; they inherited it from past generations. However, today's educators can do something about the problem by stopping the "permission to forget."

How do students learn they don't really have to learn course content? When does this first come to their mind? It is in first grade with spelling. Every American knows the process: new spelling words on Monday, practice on Tuesday, Wednesday, cram on Thursday night, test on Friday and forget on Saturday. Come to this workshop June 16, 17 and 18 to learn the L To J process for teaching your students how to remember course content.

**Day I (June 16)** will be for educators NEW to the process.

**Day II (June 17)** will be for those who attend Day I AND for others who have already been trained in L to J who want a brush-up.

**Day III (June 18)** will be to work in teams to identify the essential skills to be used for the L to J process and to prepare for classroom implementation.

(Teachers new to the process need to come all three days. Those already trained may attend Day I and Day II for a brush up to the process, Day II for a brief review, and/or Day III if they need to write an assessment plan for a different content area than they wrote last summer)
